The Show Basketball Allstar Game is in its 20th year. We bring together the States best basketball players for the final high school game of the year.

We are happy to announce that this year the Colorado High School Activities Association (CHSAA) has sanctioned the event. There are specific NCAA rules around allstar games and Division 1 Men and Women coaches. What they can and cannot attend. However, as you can see below (an email from Division1 compliance officer) that criteria NCAA Rule 13.1.7.6.5 applies because the high school governing body sanctioned our event. Thus allowing Division 1 coaches to attend. As you can imagine, there are lots of rules and it may be hard for us in basketball community to know them all as well as exceptions.

I believe this meets the criteria of 13.1.7.6.5 (below). The event is approved by CHSAA and is not being conducted for recruiting reasons. Your coaches can attend this event.

13.1.7.6.5 Events Not Subject to Certification Program. During any contact or evaluation period, an institutional coaching staff member may attend noninstitutional organized events that are approved, sponsored or conducted by an applicable state, national or international governing body and are not organized and conducted primarily for a recruiting purpose (e.g., intrastate and interstate high school basketball games, state high school all-star games, international competitions and practices associated with such contests). A coaching staff member shall not attend events that are approved, sponsored or conducted by an applicable state, national or international governing body but are organized and conducted primarily for a recruiting purpose, unless such events are certified per Bylaw [13.19](#).

We have included the letter from CHSAA (below).

It has come to our attention that some people who are trying to inform the basketball community are sending out incorrect information about The Show. I know they were trying to be informative and let you know about the rules which is good. However in this case, they did not have all the facts and are misinforming the basketball community about our event. We have asked them to retract and send out a correct information. We would ask that if you hear incorrect information, to point them to this letter.

The Show Basketball Allstar game is in its 20th year. We are very thankful for keeping this great tradition alive and honoring the top players in Colorado the opportunity to play their last high school game of the season and for some their high school career.

The games will be held March 27-29 at Metro State University, Denver.
